Students are assessed in Reading, Writing, Listening, and Speaking. They receive proficiency level scores between 1 and 6.

English learners are identified using the <u>WIDA</u>
<u>Screener</u> and then take the annual <u>ACCESS</u> for <u>ELLs</u> or <u>Alternate ACCESS</u> until they meet a state's exit criteria.*
